

# Week 7 - The New People of God

#### INTRODUCTION

We're going through a study called "Cover to Cover: A 50-Day Flyover of the Bible." By reading approximately 1-2 chapters a day and watching a few 5-8 minute videos from the Bible Project each week, we'll discover the answers to some of life's biggest questions and come to a better, more helpful understanding of the Christian faith and the beauty of its promise for the world.

### **REVIEW & DISCUSS**

- 1. Did you complete all readings? All the videos?
- 2. What stood out to you from last week's readings and videos? Any favorites or most interesting?
- 3. What strikes you the most about God's desire for us to flourish by restoring his Edenic vision as the people of God?
- 4. Watch "<u>The Royal Priest Series</u>" from the Bible Project together. It'll take you 31 minutes to watch the 6 episodes plus any discussion time between.
  - a. What does it mean that we are, as Peter says in 1 Peter 2:9, "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession."
  - b. Think of the moral law in the OT, the commands of Christ, and one-anothers of the NT. What characterizes the people of God?
- 5. Reflect on the gift and role of the Holy Spirit in our lives. How does the Holy Spirit empower us to live as the people of God?

# TAKEAWAY

- 1. What is one command or "one-another" you're aware of in your life that is needing development with the Spirit's help?
- 2. In what activities are you or would you like to be involved in helping to restore Eden on Earth? How clear is your sense that God has called you to be a part of this work?
- 3. Have you considered ways that you, as a group, together can take on some aspect of Christ's calling to love and serve others?
